60 Years of the Burton Joyce Players

In 2007 we celebrated 80 years of amateur drama at the village hall. In 1927 the grandly named Burton Joyce Amateur Dramatic and Operatic Society staged "The Giesha".



Over the next 12 years this group went on to produce 18 dramas, comedies and musicals until the group were disbanded in 1939 after places of entertainment were closed at the outbreak of the Second World War.

On the 29th May 1949, nine people met with a view to bringing amateur drama back to the village. They called the group the Burton Joyce Players, and we have been going strong ever since.

The very first production was Three One-Act Plays, and we thought it would therefore be fitting that in this, our diamond jubilee year, we once again perform Three One-Act Plays.

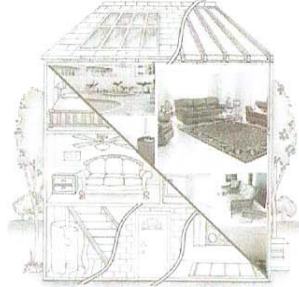
The action takes place in the living room of an old fashioned cottage on the outskirts of Fulham in the year 1900.
